The GREAT Project

With many families across Leicestershire facing childcare pressures and the increased risk of redundancy due to COVID-19 lockdown restrictions, employment support remains in acute demand.

The GREAT project (Getting Ready for Employment And Training) is addressing this by providing remote delivery across Leicestershire, that also keeps local communities safe.

After transitioning into a fully remote service, GREAT project is now opening its virtual doors to new families in need. When lockdown began in March, the project had to implement a waiting list, and have recently gained capacity to accept new cases.

"Being able to take on new referrals again could help many more families in need - particularly during these challenging times." notes Project Manager, Chantal Brotherhood.

With the support of the project's lead partner Voluntary Action LeicesterShire (VAL), GREAT currently offers group wellbeing and skills development sessions, behind the scenes employer tours and preparation for work and training with Employment Support Officers.

"Lockdown has meant that many more Leicestershire residents could now be in need of employment and training." manager Chantal Brotherhood notes.
