


Responses

- 223 responses
- Broad cross section, including local councils, interest groups, aviation stakeholders and members of the public
- 83% of responses from members of the public

68% of responses submitted using the online response form, 38% by email.

Feedback: key themes

Night noise

- Different views on night noise; QC4 ban welcomed by community groups, resisted by some airlines
- Support for our proposals to review noise related fees and charges, penalties and the introduction of daytime noise penalties

Training flights

- Suggestions for training flight procedures
- Reduced hours of availability welcomed by community groups, lack of afternoon resilience identified by airline



Feedback: other themes

- Overlap with Future Airspace Programme, and a desire to see faster airspace modernization
- Widespread support for SIGS and Community Fund enhancements
- Online noise portal welcomed, with suggestions to enhance monitoring and reporting
- Suggestions in relation to the way we should deliver actions from our Noise Action Plan



Our response

- QC4 operational ban retained
- Afternoon training period extended to reduce the risk of weather-related cancellations
- New action added: information videos
- Stakeholder feedback received will be considered as we deliver the actions set out in our Noise Action Plan
- Further engagement with the ICC as we deliver our Noise Action Plan
