## Chewing Over Grant Success!

After successfully applying for a grant of £7,200, the NWLDC are putting plans in place to reduce gum littering and

remove chewing gum from the district's streets.



The council is one of 54 across

the country to have successfully applied for funding from the Chewing Gum Task Force, administered by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy.

The money will be used to purchase specialist gum removal equipment, with signage reminding people to bin their gum also provided as part of the grant agreement.

Monitoring and evaluation carried out by Behaviour Change – a not-for-profit social enterprise – has shown that in areas that benefitted from the first year of funding, a reduced rate of gum littering was still being observed six months after clean-up and the installation of signage.

As part of the application we have provided evidence of areas across the district adversely impacted by chewing gum being discarded on the street. These areas must be tackled first as part of the grant agreement, however once this has been completed there will be an opportunity for the district council to tackle other areas of the district.

At this time we will reach out to parishes for information on your own hot spot areas, if they haven't already been attended too, of course as part of the grant project schedule.



#### Car Cruising Ban Extended

A new three-year order has been approved by cabinet on Tuesday, as a proactive way of tackling car cruising.

Dangerous driving such as racing and blocking roads, as well as noise disturbance and littering linked to car cruising, has been a particular problem in Castle Donington for several years.

In 2021, a public spaces protection order (PSPO) was approved, only banning drivers in a specific part of Castle Donington. This has now been expanded to cover a larger area.

The order will help North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) issue warning letters and advice notices and help Leicestershire Police issue fixed penalty fines to nuisance drivers across the whole of Castle Donington. It also covers parts of Hemmington.

Leicestershire Police will carry out patrols – however, a new CCTV camera and ANPR technology, funded by NWLDC, mean that officers won't need to be present to enforce the order.

Councillor Michael Wyatt, Portfolio Holder for Communities and Climate Change at NWLDC, said: "We are committed to ensuring the safety of our community and this order not only tackles dangerous driving but also targets littering and noise disturbance.

"Expanding the car cruising ban across Castle Donington demonstrates our proactive approach to tackling this issue.

"With the support of advanced technology and collaboration with Leicestershire Police, we can effectively enforce this order and maintain the quality of life for our residents."
